

Requirements for college admissions

If you want to go to one of Mississippi's eight public universities, you should meet ONE of the following criteria.

*In lieu of ACT scores, students may submit equivalent SAT scores.



Don't meet the criteria for admission ?

Students who do not meet the above criteria are still eligible for admission if they participate in a Summer Development Program (SDP) on a university campus. Students will enroll in one or more deficient subject areas (English, reading, or mathematics) based on ACT subscores and/or ACCUPLACER scores. They receive training in study skills and counseling to enhance their ability to succeed at the university. Due to COVID-19, universities are testing new delivery systems. Check with the individual university for the 2021 summer or fall options.
